At €10.745 billion for the year ended 31 December 2006, sales reported by Eiffage Group increased by 27.4% compared with 2005.

Excluding Concessions, consolidated sales recorded an increase of 11.1% over the year (of which 2.6 percentage points contributed by acquisitions) confirming that the Group's markets remained buoyant. The acquisition of APRR at the start of 2006 increased the contribution by Concessions to consolidated sales to 14%.



Construction enjoyed a high level of activity throughout the year in Europe (7.2% growth) as well as in France (7.7% growth), more particularly in the provinces, and the Group's Property activities enjoyed a strong fourth quarter, as in 2005.

Public Works benefited from favourable weather conditions, which was one reason for the buoyant performances in the fourth quarter (13.9% growth), while the increase over the year as a whole (11.6% growth) was also due to the higher raw material costs in Road Construction being passed on to customers and to acquisitions (which contributed 0.4 percentage points).

Electrical Contracting passed the €2 billion mark in 2006, with growth reaching 14.4% year-on-year, with a significant contribution from acquisitions (9.5 percentage points of which 80% in the rest of Europe).

Metallic Construction, like the Group's other divisions, enjoyed a high level of activity, with organic growth of more than 10%. Goyer contributed 20 percentage points to the sales growth recorded by the division.



APRR saw traffic increase by 1.3% in 2006. In particular, the favourable trend in heavy goods vehicle traffic observed since May 2006 carried over into the fourth quarter. This trend, combined with the new tariffs applied, resulted in toll revenues increasing by 6.5% over 2006 as a whole. Consolidated since 20 February 2006, APRR contributed €1.462 billion to consolidated sales.

Traffic on the Millau Viaduct was the same as in 2005, but a 12% increase in the proportion of heavy goods vehicles, the higher traffic during the summer and the tariff changes, enabled a 5.8% increase in toll revenues generated by the concession.



The order book increased by 17.3% year-on-year to €8.74 billion at 1 January 2007, equivalent to nearly one year's activity.

The 2006 results of Eiffage Group will be submitted for approval to the Board of Directors on 27 February and a press release will be issued following closure of the market that day.
